This transfer program, leading to an associate in arts degree, will provide students with an overview of popular fields in communication such as journalism, speech, film, radio and TV, new media, public relations and advertising. Students will learn communication theory as it relates to culture, aesthetics and society. Students will take courses drawn from a variety of disciplines.

According to the U.S. Department of Labor, nine careers in the communications field are expected to grow anywhere from 14.2 to 23.2 percent. They include careers such as film editors, camera operators, public relations specialists, writers and editors.

While this major is designed for students who wish to transfer to four-year colleges and universities, it is also valuable for those already employed in the communication field and who wish to learn additional specialized fields.

CCM to offer new course in Geospatial Technologies

In id you ever wonder how your GPS works? County College of Morris has introduced a new course in Geospatial Technology, a field of study that includes geographic information systems, global positioning systems, remote sensing and surveying. Another term for this technology is "location-aware" technology.

Geospatial technology is one of the top three emerging job markets in the country, according to the U.S. Department of Labor. Geographic databases, location and navigation receivers, and global-to-local imagery and tools are used for queries, analysis and display of information used for planning and decision making in many distinct fields. Law enforcement, environmental management, public safety, health, agriculture, information technologies and business are all career areas impacted by geographic inquiry skills.

Geospatial technologies can be used to answer questions such as: What is the largest county in your state in terms of area? Or, how can we control the mosquito population of our town?

Introduction to Geospatial Technologies is being offered as a Special Topics course at CCM beginning Thursday, March 27, at 10 a.m. in EH D205. The course is being run jointly by the Department of Information Technologies and the Department of Engineering/Engineering Technologies.
