

## Spring musical "Kiss Me Kate"

CCM's Performing Arts Department will present this year's spring musical, "Kiss Me Kate". Music and lyrics by Cole Porter. Performances are April 2 - 5 at 7:30 p.m. and 2 p.m. on April 5. "Kiss Me Kate" is a play-within-a-play musical based on Shakespeare's *The Taming of the Shrew*. It tells the tale of two once-married, now-divorced musical theater actors, Fred Graham and Lilli Vanessi, who are performing opposite each other in the roles of Petruchio and Katherine in a Broadway-bound musical version of William Shakespeare's play.

The pair begin an all-out emotional war mid-performance that threatens the production's success. The only thing keeping the show together are threats from a pair of gangsters, who have come to collect a gambling debt from the show's Lucentio, Bill Calhoun. In classic musical comedy fashion, slapstick madness ensues before everything is resolved. The show has such memorable songs as *Another Op'nin' Another Show*, *Wunderbar* and *Too Darn Hot*.

## CCM history


**1963** - Morris County Freeholders appointed eight-member study committee.

## **Spring drama “The Odyssey”**

**C**CM Shakespeare and Company will present “The Odyssey,” Mary Zimmerman’s adaptation of Homer’s epic poem. The production will be directed by Robert Cioffi, coordinator of CCM’s Shakespeare and Company. Performances will be held on April 16 - 19 at 7:30 p.m.

The play begins as a modern young woman struggles to understand Robert Fitzgerald’s translation of “The Odyssey.” When a classical muse emerges, the young woman is transformed into the goddess Athena, a tireless advocate for Odysseus in his struggle to get home. With a twist on this classic work, Zimmerman brings to life the story of Odysseus’s ten-year journey, portraying his encounters with various characters, including Circe, the Cyclops, Poseidon, Calypso, the Sirens, and others.

## **Dover teens learn leadership skills at CCM**

**O**n March 14, eighteen Dover High School students will have an opportunity to go beyond the traditional classroom experience and learn some valuable lessons in leadership. All participants are graduates of the Summer Academy for disadvantaged students at CCM. The group will reunite for a valuable experience in team building. From 9 a.m. - 1 p.m., the group will manage a make-believe restaurant and take on the roles of restaurant managers, chefs and waiters. The team building exercise will take place in the CCM Hospitality Management Teaching Kitchen, and the edible results will be served to CCM administrators, faculty and donors who made this experience possible. They number approximately 25. A question and answer period regarding what valuable lessons the students learned will follow lunch. The donors who made the program possible are the Daily Record, Bank of America and Alcoa Inc.

The Summer Academy for Young Scholars is a two-week academic enrichment program for disadvantaged teens living in the Dover and Morristown areas. About 15 students are selected by high school administrators to participate each summer. The main goal is to turn at-risk teens onto the advantage and possibility of attending college. Each day they learn about something different in hopes of sparking an interest strong enough to motivate them to continue their education.
