
CCM Design students go green for Fashion Show

This 2006 masterpiece from the Spanish director Pedro Almodovar is part noir-comedy, part ghost story and moves effortlessly between poignancy and danger, life and death, the real and the surreal. Starring Penelope Cruz in an Oscar-nominated performance, this is the story of three women who survive by means of goodness, lies and boundless vitality.

The Lives of Others

The film begins in East Berlin 1984 (five years before the fall of the Berlin Wall) and takes the viewers all the way to 1991 (in a Germany that has been reunited). Both a drama and a political thriller, the film follows Captain Gerd Wiesler as he is tasked with spying on two individuals—celebrated playwright George Dreyman and actress Christa-Maria Sieland, both of whom are suspected of not being loyal to the SED, the ruling Socialist Unity party. Wiesler becomes more and more immersed in his subject's world and in their existence which is full of all the things that Wiesler's life is lacking. Winner of the 2006 Academy Award for Best Foreign Language Film.

Persepolis

Academy Award-nominated for Best Animated Feature, *Persepolis* brings to life the poignant story of a young girl in Iran during the Islamic Revolution. Based on the stirring graphic novel memoirs of Marjane Satrapi, this witty yet deeply affecting film has captured the imaginations of audiences and critics worldwide. The issues of love, family and freedom that fill the adolescent life of a young girl are reflected in the revolutionary struggles that surround her in 1970's Iran.
