## **CCM Reaffirmed for Accreditation**

**T**he Middle States visiting team, led by Dr. James Links, will send CCM a formal report of its findings very soon.

Meanwhile, in his informal exit report, Dr. Links indicated that CCM had successfully passed all of the critical fourteen standards that Middle States measured and that we will be reaffirmed for accreditation.

Pending the formal notification, this means the college have passed our Middle States accreditation.

This accreditation will be valid for the next ten years. However, it will include a periodic review in five years to see how much progress we have made on the recommendations and suggestions offered in the report.

We would like to express our appreciation to all of the members of the college community who worked so hard on this project. We are particularly grateful to the 120+ people who worked so earnestly on our various Middle States workgroups.

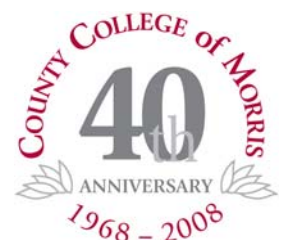
The 2008 CCM Middle State process was truly a team effort. Thanks to all who helped make this important college project a success.
