The development of the college seal

As commencement draws near, our college seal becomes more prevalent.



Did you ever wonder how it was developed? The direction to design a college seal was given to Jostens, a company who designs and sells school rings. Jostens created seven designs, including this one which college administrators selected. The design chosen uses the following elements:

The *Lamp of Learning* is on the crest of the seal representing the paramount purpose of the institution.

The center of the seal is divided into three parts.

- ◆ The *Polaris and Globe*, which represents the guiding role that education plays in the world.
- ◆ The second part is the *Atomic Symbol*, which represents the age in which the institution was founded—the 60's.
- ◆ The bottom part holds the *Helmet*, adopted from the Morris County seal, symbolizing the sponsorship of the college by the county.


The year 1965 represents the resolution by the freeholders establishing the college, and interestingly enough, the three dots on either side of the year denotes the fact that New Jersey was the third of the original 13 states.

The motto "Sapere Aude" means "Dare to Know" and was suggested by Albert Merk. That motto has since grown to be the title of the alma mater written by Sander Zulauf, Associate Professor of English, for the inauguration of President Yaw.

Summer Student Aides

If your department would like to employ student aides this summer, download the Request for Student Aides form at www.ccm.edu/pdf/studentaide.pdf and return to Career Services and Cooperative Education by May 17.

If your current student aide is being rehired for the summer, they need to report to Cohen Hall B236 before May 19. *Before they can be hired or rehired, students must have already registered for at least six credits for the fall semester.*

Remember that only those students who have been officially hired or rehired are permitted to work after May 17.

Work-Study Reminders

2007-2008 work-study awards remain in effect through June 30; therefore, work-study students will continue to draw on their current academic year awards through June 30. As of July 1, students whose 2008-2009 financial aid has been finalized will begin to earn their new work-study awards.

If a student’s 2007-2008 award is exhausted before June 30 and/or if student’s 2008-2009 award is not finalized as of July 1, the student’s earnings will be charged to his/her department’s budget until such time as his/her eligibility for work-study has been determined.
