Morris Area Mathematics Alliance holds 31st meeting

The Morris Area Mathematics Alliance held their 31st successful meeting at CCM on April 30. The program included 22 workshops in round-table format. Sessions included a wide variety of topics of interest to teachers from kindergarten through college. Skip counting through literature, flips, slides and turns, Alaska and the Iditarod race, family math night, technology, bouncing billiards, e-boards, applets and websites galore, and brainteasers were some of the discussions offered by the 26 speakers. Our own **Jorge Sarmiento**, **Roger McCoach**, **Cathy Willms** and **Chris Fenwick** were among the presenters. The teachers especially liked ideas usable in their classrooms.

More than 110 teachers attended. Math alliance members feel a common responsibility for improving elementary, secondary and college mathematics teaching. Professors **Joan Monaghan**, **Doreen Sabella**, **Meimee Persau** and **Elizabeth Polen** serve on the 12-member Steering Committee which plans the semi-annual meetings.
