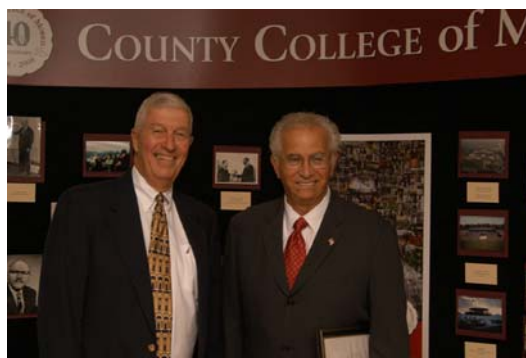
### Free 40th Anniversary Lecture Series (1st of four)

## CCM to host Storytelling Festival

County College of Morris has gathered three popular storytellers, to perform and teach at a Storytelling Festival from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Sunday, November 2 in the Student Community Center. The day-long event is suitable for teachers, parents and children who want to learn more about the art of storytelling and watch performances.

The festival will begin with a workshop for parents and teachers to be held from 10 a.m. to noon. Participants will learn how to find, select and tell a story. Using three tales from different countries, participants will discover how to use their voice and gestures to enhance a story. Teachers will also have an opportunity to discuss ways to integrate storytelling into the curriculum. Six sessions of storytelling and music for all ages will run from 12:30 to 4 p.m.

**Fred Quinn** is a bilingual storyteller, fluent in Spanish. He is the president of the Garden State Storytellers and has performed at pre-schools, festivals, community groups and churches throughout the state.
