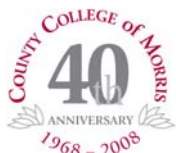
Health Care Coverage Open Enrollment

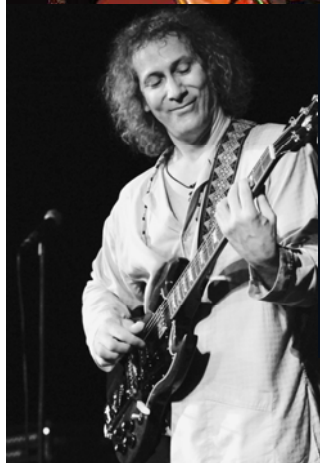
