## Active Admissions

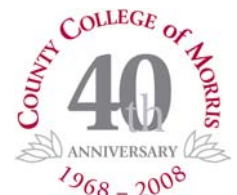
As some of you may have heard, the college recently purchased a new Datatel product called Active Admissions. This exciting addition will have many benefits for students as well as faculty and staff. For example, when a student applies online, all of his or her information will automatically be stored in Datatel. There will be no need to re-enter the data.

Active Admission will also allow prospective students to "personalize" their online experience with CCM. They will tell us more about what they like and what type of information they want from CCM, and we will be able to personalize that information specifically for them. For example, if a perspective student indicates that he or she is interested in pursuing a degree in Journalism, the system will help us tag information geared specifically to Journalism majors. When they go online, they will see information about the Journalism curriculum, faculty, transfer possibilities, former students who majored in journalism and even CCM events that may interest them.

What you may also find exciting is the opportunity to target market directly to students who have expressed an interest in a specific program. For example, we can request an email list, targeting students who filled out an online profile with an interest in journalism, and email them information about new courses, new faculty or events pertaining to journalism. This is the first time CCM will have an opportunity to truly do one-on-one target marketing.

In addition, Active Admissions will serve as an interactive recruitment tool and guide students through the enrollment process. For example, once they apply, they will see a check list of what needs to be done in the enrollment process. As each step is completed, it will be checked off their personal list. We will also have the ability to know where students are in the process and communicate what they need to do next.
