## CCM to host photo exhibit on Cuba

*The streets, struggles and spirit of Cuba are the focus of a photo exhibit by photographer Joe Guerriero at County College of Morris from Nov. 3 to Dec. 20 in the Masten Library Art Gallery. A reception with the photographer will be held from noon to 1:30 p.m., Nov. 11, also in the Masten Gallery. For many years, Joe has been a freelance photographer for CCM. Many of his photos are in CCM publications and on our website. Stop by the gallery to see his other work. Guerriero is also an adjunct professor of photography at Sussex Community College.*

*Guerriero has visited Cuba many times to capture its complex culture, history and politics. “In my many visits to Cuba, I have photographed what I perceive to be three domains of life there,” he said. According to Guerriero, the streets represent life played out in music, camaraderie and the sounds of neighbors at work and play.*

*The struggle of daily life can be seen in the face of these strong and patient people, explained Guerriero. And their spirit is found in the religion of Santeria, which is like the calm eye of the storm. Time has made Cuba what it is today, as it has been for 48 years, a beguiling and continuing mystery for Americans and other foreigners.*

*“No doubt the coming years will bring significant change to Cuba,” said Guerriero. “But whatever happens, the country’s essence, however tempered by change and commercialization, will as always be danced passionately in the streets.”*
