CCM board approves budget and increases tuition

On December 17, the County College of Morris Board of Trustees approved a \$54 million operating budget for the 2009 / 2010 fiscal year, which runs from July 1, 2009 to June 30, 2010. The budget increased 4.7 percent above the 2008 / 09 budget. The county funded portion of the budget will be presented to the Board of School Estimate in February. CCM will ask the county for \$12.1 million, a 5.2 percent decrease from the 2008 / 09 budget.

Trustees also voted unanimously to increase tuition by \$6 per credit starting in the summer 2009 semester. Therefore, tuition for in-county students will rise from \$99 to \$105 per credit.

Out-of-county student tuition will increase from \$198 to \$210 per credit and out-of-state student will rise from \$278 to \$296 per credit. A per-credit college fee will also increase \$1, from \$15 per credit to \$16 per credit. The new tuition increase translates to approximately \$72 per semester for a full-time student taking 12 credits. Despite using more than \$1 million from CCM's available fund balance, CCM President Edward J. Yaw said the tuition increase is unavoidable and the result of several factors: support from the state will not increase, county funding will decrease, and fixed costs such as benefits, insurance and utilities will increase.
