TD Bank Supports CCM Planetarium

Ruth Wilson, vice president of TD Bank in Randolph, presented a check for \$7,500 for the new planetarium at the County College of Morris. Also representing TD Bank was Debra Meister, assistant vice president and store manager of the bank's Randolph, NJ branch. The gift was accepted by CCM President Dr. Edward J. Yaw and CCM Foundation Vice President Joseph Vitale. Fundraising for the new facility has now topped \$400,000 and plans are under way to have the new CCM Planetarium open by year's end. The planetarium, which is 37 years old, hosts more than 14,000 visitors a year, most of them school children ages 6 to 10 from surrounding school districts. The new facility, when opened, will feature a state-of-the-art projection system, a new sound and lighting system, and enhanced seating. The entire project is being paid for by individual, corporate and private foundation contributions.
