Poetry and Jazz at CCM in National Poetry Month

On Wednesday, April 22, at 7 p.m., in the LRC Reading Room, poet Sander Zulauf and musicians Rich Gradone, Jose Bevia, and Todd Collins will combine their arts for an evening of poetry and jazz at County College of Morris to celebrate National Poetry Month. This free event is part of the college year-long 40th anniversary celebration.

CCM Professor Sander Zulauf will be reading from his third book of poetry, *Where Time Goes*, which was released by Dryad Press in Washington, D.C., in September. Since 1973, Zulauf has taught English, literature, writing and poetry at CCM. He also is editor of the college-sponsored *Journal of New Jersey Poets*, was founding editor of the *Index of American Periodical Verse*, and serves as Poet Laureate of the Episcopal Church in the Newark Diocese. He also co-edited *The Poets of New Jersey: From Colonial to Contemporary* in 2005 (Jersey Shore Publications). His poetry and essays have appeared in many national publications such as the *Christian Science Monitor* and the *New York Times*. Poetry from *Where Time Goes* has been nominated for the 2010 Pushcart Prize in poetry.

CCM Professor Richard Gradone (cornet) has played with the U.S. Air Force Band for Presidents Johnson and Nixon. He has also played many freelance performances and made studio recordings with such musical legends as Robert Goulet, Placido Domingo, Nancy Wilson, Lou Rawls, Rosemary Clooney, Warren Vache, Peter Duchin, Pat and Debby Boone, and the great American entertainer Bob Hope. He holds a PhD in music from NYU.

Poetry and Jazz at CCM (cont'd)

CCM Professor Jose Bevia (piano and keyboard), a native of Alicante in Spain, graduated from Valencia Conservatory of Music in 1995 where he studied classical piano with Jose Luis de Prado. He moved to the US in 2000 and now holds a Doctor of Music Composition from Florida State University. He has worked with many noted classical and jazz pianists, and studied composition with the Czech composer Ladislav Kubik, electronic music with Mark Wingate, and jazz piano with Marcus Roberts, Bill Peterson, and Kevin Bales, and composition with Pulitzer prize winner Ellen Zwilich. He is winner of the 2006 University of West Florida Phillips Jazz Piano Competition, the 2007 BMI Foundation Charlie Parker Composition Prize, a finalist in the 2006 Brussels Jazz Orchestra International Composition Contest, and won Honorable Mention at the Minnesota Orchestra Composer Institute. The University of Northern Colorado Jazz Press publishes his compositions worldwide. He is Associate Professor of Music at CCM.

CCM Professor Todd Collins performs mainly in the northeastern U.S., Scotland and England. His guitar and mandolin performances range from progressive bluegrass to swing (Blueswing Trio), contemporary jazz, acoustic blues (The Booglerizers), rock (The Humphries), and classical. His current traditional bluegrass CD, “Blue Soul,” is receiving national and international airplay. A new CD of classical mandolin duets with Emanuele Barbella and John Sheehan of Railroad Earth is scheduled for release this spring. He is Assistant Professor and coordinator of the Music Technology program at CCM (www.toddcollinsmusic.com).

A reception will be held after the performance and books and CDs will be available for purchase and signing. Admission is free. Opportunities to engage in boating, swimming and fishing are diminished if water quality is impaired. Impaired water quality impacts shellfish production, tourism at beaches and coastal communities. Most importantly, it increases drinking water treatment costs.

- ◆ Limit your use of fertilizers and pesticides.
- ◆ Properly use and dispose of hazardous products.

- ◆ Don't feed wildlife.
- ◆ Don't litter.
- ◆ Dispose of yard waste properly.

Landscape and Horticultural Technology Update

Thirteen Landscape and Horticultural Technology students (and two faculty members) traveled to California to compete in Planet Student Career Days, a national landscape competition that draws nearly 1,000 horticulture students from both four-year and two-year schools across the country. Our LHT students really did great this year. Chris Backshall placed 5th in the country and Bill Bruer placed 19th qualifying both for PLANET Super Star status, while first time attendee Dan Coiro placed 38 despite competing in just 4 events. A great accomplishment and great efforts for all of them. In addition, for the first time we finished in the top three in three different events. Ted Kozlosky finished second in Compact Excavator Operation, the team of David Los and Ted Kozlosky finished second in Wood Construction, and the team of Chris Backshall, Bill Bruer, and Dan Coiro finished second in Landscape Plant Installation. These placements are outstanding for a program of our size and these students really showed their talent and ability and made CCM proud.
