## Foreign Film *The Kite Runner*, to play at CCM

County College of Morris will host the foreign film *The Kite Runner*, at 7:30 p.m., Friday, May 22 in the Dragonetti Auditorium.

Adapted from the recently acclaimed novel by Khaled Hosseini, *The Kite Runner* tells the story of a young boy from the Wazir Akbar Khan district of Kabul, who betrayed his best friend and lives in regret. The story is set against a backdrop of tumultuous events, from the fall of the monarchy in Afghanistan through the Soviet invasion, the mass exodus of refugees in Pakistan and the United States, and the rise of the Taliban regime. It was the 2007 Academy Award Nominee for Best Foreign Language Film and Best Original Score.

Admission is \$7. A moderated discussion with light refreshments will follow the film. The box office opens at 7 p.m. This film is intended for mature audiences only. Rated R.

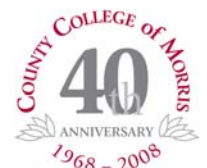
## Earth Day

CCM will present a free lecture by Costas Panagopoulos titled "100 Days and Counting: President Barack Obama and the 2008 Election Mandate," at 11:30 a.m. April 22 in the Student Community Center Davidson Room.

Panagopoulos is Assistant Professor of Political Science at Fordham University and Director of the Center for Electoral Politics and Democracy at the university.

Panagopoulos, a leading expert on campaigns and elections, voting behavior, public opinion, and campaign finance, was part of the Decision Desk team at NBC News during the 2006 election cycle. A former candidate for the Massachusetts State Legislature in 1992, Panagopoulos also offers courses on campaign management and strategy, message development, and political communication.
