The awards were given out at the annual N.J. Collegiate Press Association luncheon and conference on Saturday, April 18 at the Trenton Marriott Hotel. The N.J. Better College Newspaper Contest honors New Jersey's journalists, as well as their writing, illustrations, and photography. This year, The Youngtown Edition took first place in General Excellence for two-year colleges, and second place in Layout and Design.

There are 12 categories for the individual staff members and two for the newspaper itself. All entries are judged by professional journalists at the major newspapers in the state.

Judging includes entries that cover local campus events and college life; however, the overall quality of the paper is what is really evaluated.
