## Congratulations Class of 2009

On May 28, approximately 400 smiling graduates participated in commencement exercises at County College of Morris. This year marked the college's 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Since the college opened its doors in 1968, 41,231 students have earned degrees or certificates. In the 2008/09 academic year, 1101 students received one of these four degrees: an associate in arts, an associate in fine arts, an associate in science or an associate in applied science.

## 2009 Peace Prize Winner

The recipient of the 2009 County College of Morris Peace Prize is Nicole Czekaj, whose project was a DVD of her poetry, music and visuals entitled “I Wish the War Would End.” Nicole’s faculty mentor was Dr. Noel Robinson of the Department of English and Philosophy.

Alpha Kappa Kappa, the CCM chapter of Phi Theta Kappa, received Honorable Mention for its DVD, “The Paradox of Affluence,” which chronicles its project of providing assistance to Cuttington University in Liberia.

This year, after ten projects were submitted, five were forwarded to the judges for final consideration.

At Commencement, Nicole received a \$1,000 award provided by the CCM Foundation and a beautiful plaque in recognition of her achievement.

In addition, her name will be the eighth to be added to the permanent plaque now located in the Student Center.

Students that score 54-68 on the Accuplacer Basic Math Test are eligible to take Mat 060. Students that don’t need Basic Math, but need Basic Algebra and Intermediate Algebra can also take the course. This course allows a student to finish their Math remediation in one semester.
