Message from the President H1N1 Update

In my first message earlier this month regarding the H1N1 virus, I stated that I would keep the college community updated on important developments regarding a possible outbreak of the virus this fall. I would like to inform the college community that we have our first verbally confirmed case of Influenza A, which may be H1N1. The infected student notified her faculty and our Health Services Office late Thursday, Sept. 18. In addition to following the standard disinfecting procedures, our Plant and Maintenance performed a second disinfecting treatment to the classrooms and the general vicinities where the student had been.

This is a good opportunity to remind everyone that prevention is key to controlling the outbreak of all flu on campus. Don't forget to:

- Wash your hands often and utilize the disinfectant dispensers that are installed in hallways and restrooms around campus.
- Cover your mouth when coughing and sneeze into your elbow or shoulder.
- Stay home if you feel flu-like symptoms coming on.
- If you are ill, wait until your temperature is normal for at least 24 hours before returning to work or class.

This possible initial occurrence of H1N1 on campus is not unexpected. We certainly anticipate – and are planning for – cases of the virus at CCM this fall. In that regard, we continue to work closely with local, state and federal health authorities on recommended practices and procedures. (cont'd)

In an effort to keep everyone informed and healthy during this flu season, the college will host the following events:

- On Oct. 1 from 1 to 2 p.m., the college will host a panel discussion by members of the Morris County and Randolph Health Departments. The entire campus community, including students, is invited to attend. The panel will discuss both the seasonal flu and H1N1 and answer questions.
- The Health Services Office will manage information and sign up tables for the Oct. 6 flu clinic. Consent forms will be available. Payment is due on Oct. 6. The tables will be set up between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. on the following days and locations:
 - Sept 28 – Outside B-Café
 - Sept. 30 – Student Community Center
- Flu and Pneumonia Clinic – Oct. 6

Students, faculty and staff will have an opportunity to receive the seasonal flu shot and pneumonia shot from 8 to 10 a.m., Oct. 6 in the LRC Reading Room. The clinic is hosted by Health Services at CCM and administered by the Randolph Health Department. The seasonal flu shot is \$15. The pneumonia shot is \$25.
