## Construction Update

As you know, renovation work is taking place in the Academic Complex (DeMare and Cohen halls). The purpose of the renovation is to improve and modernize those facilities with better heating and cooling systems, improved lighting, and upgraded and more attractive bathrooms. We understand that this project is causing inconvenience for those who work and attend classes in DeMare and Cohen halls. We apologize for that inconvenience and are working to complete those projects as quickly as possible. We will continue to update the CCM community in each issue of the CCMemo until all work is completed. Here is the current status of the projects:

**Restrooms in DeMare Hall:** The contractor is scheduling the inspections for all three restrooms for next week. As soon as the college has approval from the Town of Randolph, the renovated restrooms will be opened.

**Restrooms in Cohen Halls:** Demolition will not begin until the DeMare Hall restrooms are completed and opened to the college community. All materials and fixtures are onsite for this set of restrooms so renovation will take less time than the DeMare Hall restrooms.

**Academic Complex Second-Floor Corridors:** Installation of new lighting is underway with Sheffield Hall nearly completed. The remainder of the lights, emergency lights and exit signs will be installed throughout the week. The ceilings will be closed after the Town of Randolph's "above ceiling" inspections are completed and approved.

**Cohen & DeMare Hall HVAC:** The boilers are being installed and the rooftop towers are to be replaced today (Friday, Sept. 24). Piping work in the mechanical room is continuing and the pumps will be installed as soon as they arrive.

**LRC Upper Level HVAC:** Fabrication of a new air handler and fan wall is progressing as the materials are delivered to the site. The work in the second-floor ceiling will be scheduled as soon as new supply boxes are delivered.

## **Radiography Program Information Sessions**

"Radiography is a relatively new allied health profession that has grown in leaps and bounds in recent years," notes professor Denise Vill'Neuve, chair of the Department of Allied Health. For any new room reservation or modification, please send an email to Cheryl Smarth at [csmarth@ccm.edu](mailto:csmarth@ccm.edu) with the requested information in your subject line and the following information in your email:

- Event name
- Requesting department
- Contact person
- Date of event
- Time of event (include start, end and set-up times)
- Requested room: classroom, lecture hall, computer lab, auditorium
- Number of rooms
- Maximum number of seats required: ex. 10, 20, 30, 40, 50, 80, 100

Reservations from academic departments should copy the dean and department chair.

Once the request is made, you will receive a confirmation email from the system. The room reservation will show on the Event Calendar on the CCM website. The requesting department is responsible for putting up and removing signage for the event.

Please note when requesting changes for credit courses, an email should be sent to the academic chairperson of your department.
