Construction Update

Restrooms in Cohen Hall: The contractor is continuing to install ceramic tile in the restrooms and that work is now approximately 65-percent completed. The tile work should be completed by next week. Other rough electrical, plumbing and related work is ongoing as the tile work progresses. The college is continuing to push to have the restrooms completed by early December. Additional light fixtures were installed this week over the sinks in DeMare Hall that were on back-order from the manufacturer.

Academic Complex Second-Floor Corridors: The ceilings have been substantially completed with only minor items remaining. The new four-foot square lights are installed and the trim will be completed next week. The wallpaper installation is underway and should also be completed shortly.

Cohen & DeMare Halls HVAC: The pumps have been installed and are circulating water through the system. The existing electric boiler is operational and providing heat to the perimeter offices and classrooms. The air handler installation has been completed and is circulating fresh air that is also being heated by the system's reheat coils. The new boilers have been installed and piped. The new boilers are awaiting control work and the completion of the flues. While heat is circulating in the complex, control of the heat will be limited for another two weeks. Plant and Maintenance is making every effort to control the heat distribution manually.

Rooftop Unit Replacement Project: The rooftop units have been started up. They still need to be tested and inspected. An initial punch list was created for the project and the upgraded motors will be installed shortly. After the new motors are installed, the system will be balanced and the HVAC controls work completed.

Learning Resource Center (LRC) Upper-Level HVAC: Installation of the air handler has been completed. The work in the second-floor LRC ceiling also has been completed except for four dual duct boxes and some wiring. The system in the LRC should be running again at full capacity by the end of the month. The new system will provide additional flexibility in air flow and utilizes smaller more efficient fans instead of one large fan.

Electronic New Jersey <http://www2.scc.rutgers.edu/njh/>. Electronic New Jersey was started in 1997, and since then they have worked with partners at the New Jersey State Archives and the New Jersey Historical Society to create interactive and engaging learning materials for teachers and students. The materials here are intended primarily for use by high school and university students, and include sections on Paul Robeson, the Cold War, and social protests of the 1960s and 1970s. Each section includes a brief historical overview, along with a "Time Capsule" that asks students to choose materials from the digital archive and create their own "mini-exhibit." The other documents included in each section range from oral histories to historic maps, and do a really nice job of offering an entry point for close examination of each topic.

Construction Update (cont'd)

Upcoming Projects: The college is beginning to schedule work to take place over the winter break, including replacing the corridor carpeting for the entire second floor of the Academic Complex and renovating three general purpose classrooms and three faculty offices. If scheduling permits, work also may begin on the installation of new light fixtures in multiple locations throughout the campus as part of a federal energy efficiency grant through Morris County. The new light fixtures are higher performance units that also will provide a significant improvement in efficiency.
