The School of Management and Labor Relations offers a direct admissions Bachelor of Science program for transfer students who are interested in the "people side of business."

The program is amazingly flexible in scheduling, credit transfer and is a well-rounded program for any individual interested in the study of work and social change management. The School of Management and Labor Relations (SMLR) can grant up to 60 credits in almost all degrees.
