CCM Radiography Students Gain Second Place Award at Radiologic Technologists Conference

Students Winning Technical Exhibit Addresses Importance of Diverse Language Skills

A group of radiography students from County College of Morris (CCM) captured the second place award at the 2011 New Jersey Society of Radiologic Technologists Conference in Atlantic City for their technical exhibit on the importance of diverse language skills in health-care settings.

The exhibit, "Many Nations... One Profession," consists of recordings in 20 different languages of expressions and directions radiologists consistently use when working with patients.

"X-ray technologists see a lot of diversity in their field, so we picked the 20 top languages and recorded different instructions for conducting chest x-rays, such as 'Hold Your Breath' and 'Don't Move,'" explained Amberen Hasib of Hackettstown. Other students who worked on the exhibit were Zainad Hosaini of Parsippany, Nancy Nowicki of Randolph, Jamee Menza of Parsippany, Nancy Sullivan of Long Valley and Mariam Yagoobi of Lake Hiawatha.

Along with that second place award, Hasib also took third place in the conference's Student X-ray Bee. A total of four CCM students made it to the final round in that competition. More than 100 radiography students from across the state participated in that competition.

"My confidence just soared at the conference," said Hasib. "It was very informative and showed that they are teaching us really well at CCM. Our professors are great. They push you and they want you to succeed."


Into the Woods


• EOF Office Temporarily Relocated

NAACP: A Century in the Fight for Freedom <http://my-loc.gov/Exhibitions/NAACP/pages/default.aspx>

The Library of Congress has an online exhibit of 70 items regarding the history of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), and their ultimate goal is to have over 150 items online here. There are several ways for visitors to learn about the history of the NAACP from this website. The slideshow on the homepage has half a dozen or so slides that comprise the themes of the exhibit, such as "The New Negro Movement," "The Civil Rights Era," and a "Renewal of the Struggle." Clicking on "Learn More" of any of the brief descriptions that accompany the photos in the slideshow will take visitors to an expanded explanation, as well as give them the opportunity to see all the items for that theme. With a video introduction by actor Laurence Fishburne, the "Interactive Timeline" highlights events and people that influenced the founding of the NAACP in 1909. Upon entering the timeline, visitors will see a map of milestones, which they can click on for a description of the event, and to see the impact of the event on a map below the map of milestones.
