The Women's Center at CCM is offering a 12-week program to help women with developing life-enhancing skills while empowering them in a supportive group environment. "Empowerment!" is an interactive program with engaging techniques that help promote a methodology for positive thinking, a coaching model that offers accountability, and ways to energize personal and professional growth, tap into leadership skills and more. The course is facilitated by its creator, Jeanne Rohach, a certified women's empowerment coach and consultant.

Tax Year 2015 W-2 Forms Online

Tax year 2015 W-2 forms are available online via CCM Webadvisor. As was the case last year, W-2 forms will only be available in this electronic format. In accordance with IRS regulations, employees are required to consent to receive an electronic W-2. After logging into Webadvisor, go to the "Employees" menu. Once there, click on "W-2 Electronic Consent" and then click the top option. After giving consent, you can view and print your W-2 from the "Employees" page by selecting "W-2 Statements." Five years of W-2s will be available for access at any time, including years that paper forms were issued.

Program Helps Communicate to Children About Drug Use

Human Resources is hosting "The 15 Minute Child Break," a one-hour, interactive, multimedia presentation, based on current research that will inform, encourage and empower parents, educators and caregivers to effectively communicate with children about the dangers of drugs and alcohol.

This program includes comprehensive information on the heroin epidemic that is facing our communities and how to effectively address the issue with children.

The program helps address:
