CCM Offers New AAS Degree in Information Technology



Beginning this fall, students entering CCM can pursue an Associate in Applied Science (AAS) in Information Technology. Graduates can directly enter the job market or continue their education at a four-year college.

“Planning and managing an organization’s information technology infrastructure is a difficult and complex job that requires a solid foundation in applied computing as well as management and people skills,” says Nancy Binowski, chairperson and professor of the Department of Information Technologies.

The new AAS in Information Technology will offer students five separate tracks of specialization to choose from: Web Development, Mobile Application Development, Digital Forensics, Security and Networking. Students will also develop the skills required for A+, Security+ and Network+ industry certifications, something that the current job market demands of IT professionals.
