Drawing on his more than 40 years of graphic design experience, Professor Steve Longo, who directs the Graphic Design Program at County College of Morris (CCM), felt that with all of the new technology currently being taught it was time to rediscover graphic design's creative roots. Toward that end, he has put together an exhibition – Generations of Genius – featuring the work of top designers from around the country.



The exhibition takes place August 30 – October 7 in the Art and Design Gallery. A reception will be held on Thursday, September 8, from 6 to 8 p.m.

The retrospective features the work of some of the most celebrated graphic designers including Milton Glaser, whose designs include the psychedelic Bob Dylan poster; Seymour Chwast, who designed the first McDonald's Happy Meal box; Luba Lukova, whose work is represented in the permanent collection of MoMA; Paul Jervis, whose accounts include Volkswagen, United Airlines, Xerox and Miller Lite; and Mike Quon, a graphic artist who popularized his lively brushstroke style in advertising, design and illustration, whose 103 year-old father and early Disney animator will also have his work on exhibit.
