The exhibition takes place August 30 – October 7 in the Art and Design Gallery. A reception will be held on Thursday, September 8, from 6 to 8 p.m.

The retrospective features the work of some of the most celebrated graphic designers including Milton Glaser, whose designs include the psychedelic Bob Dylan poster; Seymour Chwast, who designed the first McDonald's Happy Meal box; Luba Lukova, whose work is represented in the permanent collection of MoMA; Paul Jervis, whose accounts include Volkswagen, United Airlines, Xerox and Miller Lite; and Mike Quon, a graphic artist who popularized his lively brushstroke style in advertising, design and illustration, whose 103 year-old father and early Disney animator will also have his work on exhibit.

Jane Biron's Ceramic Sculptures on Display



From now through December 31, 2016, visit Madison, New Jersey's Museum of Early Trades and Crafts (METC) where CCM staff member Jane Biron has a selection of ceramic sculptures on display in a show titled: "Good Earth – Pottery and Terra Cotta Industries in New Jersey." The METC Gift Shop also has a selection of many of Biron's smaller pieces for sale.

"Almost everything I make starts out as a drawing or a photograph," says Biron. "I always use high-fire clay so that I can fire my pieces with whichever technique I think will be most beneficial. I use an electric kiln, a pit-fire, Raku, salt and Anagama – depending on the look I'm after." Each of these techniques has their own methods of firing, and Biron
