FRIENDLY REMINDERS

End of Summer Hours and Changing Hours of Operation

Effective Monday, August 29, the college will return to its regular work hours of 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. Employees who have been taking a half-hour unpaid lunch during summer hours may resume a one-hour lunch period on that date. Please also note that the college will be closed Labor Day on Monday, September 5.

As regular hours resume, some areas of "Hours of Operation" on the Quicklinks bar on the CCM homepage will need to be changed back. When this feature was originally conceived, it was to be the responsibility of the administrative assistants in each department to keep department hours up to date. John Hester, CCM digital communications coordinator, has put together a step-by-step guide on how to do this.

1. Go to <http://tinyurl.com/pjra82m>.
2. You will be prompted for your username and password. These are the same ones you use to log onto your computer in the morning. If you can't log in, contact jhester@ccm.edu in order to have IT add you to the user list.
3. Select your department from the drop down list.
4. Change any information you need to change.
5. Since the "Hours" box is not a rich text box, you will need to add some HTML tags to format: `
` to add a break, ``this will bold text``
6. Once you hit "Submit," your information will be updated on the website.

Generations of Genius



Drawing on his more than 40 years of graphic design experience, Professor Steve Longo, who directs the Graphic Design Program at County College of Morris (CCM), felt that with all of the new technology currently being taught it was time to rediscover graphic design's creative roots. Toward that end, he has put together an exhibition – Generations of Genius – featuring the work of top designers from around the country. The exhibition takes place August 30 – October 7 in the Art and Design Gallery. A reception will be held on Thursday, September 8, from 6 to 8 p.m.

The retrospective features the work of some of the most celebrated graphic designers including Milton Glaser, whose designs include the psychedelic Bob Dylan poster; Seymour Chwast, who designed the first McDonald's Happy Meal box; Luba Lukova, whose work is represented in the permanent collection of MoMA; Paul Jervis, whose accounts include Volkswagen, United Airlines, Xerox and Miller Lite; and Mike Quon, a graphic artist who popularized his lively brushstroke style in advertising, design and illustration, whose 103 year-old father and early Disney animator will also have his work on exhibit.
