Dr. Anthony J. Iacono, a community college graduate, became the third president of County College of Morris (CCM) on September 1. Prior to that he served as Vice President of Academic Affairs at Indian River State College (IRSC) in Fort Pierce, FL. At IRSC, he also held the positions of Associate Dean for Developmental Education and full-time Professor of History.

“Pursuing an educational goal takes courage, imagination, sacrifice and, among many other things, a lot of hard work. It also requires a dedicated community of educators who enthusiastically support your dream of earning a college degree, obtaining the career of your choice and, in short, helping you create an
