Minimum Wage Increase

Effective January 1, New Jersey's minimum hourly wage increased to \$8.44. Student employees currently making \$8.38 will now earn \$8.44 per hour. The hourly rate for student workers who already earn more than \$8.38 will not change.

Departments will need to adjust their budgets to accommodate these changes and do so with no additional funding. Supervisors will also want to keep in mind that with this hourly increase, work-study students will exhaust their awards sooner unless the number of hours they work is adjusted.

Standard Mileage Rate

Effective January 1, the standard mileage rate is 53.5 cents per mile for business miles driven.
