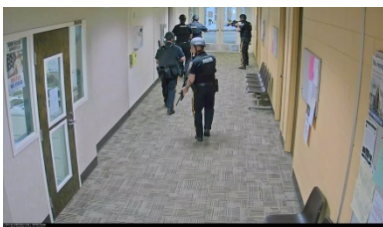

Active Threat Drill on Campus



On Friday, June 23, the Public Safety Department and the Randolph Police conducted an active threat drill in the Academic Complex. The drill started at 10 a.m. and involved an actor in the buildings playing the role of a suspect.

Randolph Police responded and conducted a search for the suspect. The CCM Emergency Operation Center (EOC) was utilized as the Command Post.

Public Safety personnel assigned to the EOC used the college's video surveillance system to track the suspect and communicate information to the Police Incident Commander. The drill tested the Public Safety department's camera technology, inter-communication capabilities and mass notification system. Overall the drill was successful in testing the college's preparedness and response to such an event. Future drills will be conducted that will progressively involve more of the campus community.

Also on the webpage is CCM's Emergency Response Guide that contains information you can use during emergency events on campus. The Public Safety department would also like to take this opportunity to thank the CCM fire marshals who assisted as monitors during the drill.

If you have a concern about an employee who is displaying behaviors that may interfere with his or her ability to be successful in the workplace or whose behavior is substantially interfering with the work environment of his or her colleagues, please let your supervisor know. Faculty and staff are frequently in a position to observe student behaviors that indicate distress or potentially compromised personal well-being. If you have a concern about a student who is displaying behaviors that may interfere with the student's ability to be successful in the college environment, please let the Public Safety department and the Counseling and Student Success office know about your concerns.

Recognizing the early warning signs and reporting your concerns that someone may be heading towards a crisis is always the best method for prevention.
