Radiography Students Obtain 100-Percent Pass Rate



Radiography students from the Class of 2017 at CCM recently obtained a 100-percent pass rate on the American Registry of Radiologic Technologist (ARRT) exam.

This is the third time in recent years that CCM Radiography students have gained a 100-percent pass rate. The CCM classes of 2014 and 2012 also had perfect pass rates. The Class of 2017 consisted of 27 Radiography students.

"I'm very proud of our students," said Denise Vill'Neuve, chair of the Allied Health Department at CCM. "They work very hard. This is not an easy program and many of the students have other commitments they also need to take care of outside of school."

Radiologic technologists work throughout the healthcare setting to create medical images to aid radiologists and other doctors with diagnosing and treating medical problems. The CCM program consists of one year of general education followed by two full years, including summers, for clinical education.

Campus Safety Workshops

Gatto, of Morristown, was presented with a \$5,000 grant through the NSF Research Experience for Undergraduates program. With that grant, he was able to conduct research into machine learning at the New Jersey Institute of Technology (NJIT). In addition, he was provided with free room and board at NJIT.

Along with nine other students from New Jersey and New York, Gatto spent 10 weeks working with NJIT Professor Usman Roshan on artificial intelligence.

Please note that the pause does not apply to mission critical requests relating to mandatory compliance reporting.

CCM Password Expiration

As part of CCM's password expiration procedure, to ensure the security of our network and data, passwords are set to expire on Thursday, October 12, for most individuals. Two weeks prior to the expiration date, you will start seeing prompts that your password is expiring whenever you login to your computer or to your web based E-mail account. When you get the prompt, you will have the option of changing your password at that time, or deferring to a later time up to the expiration date.

Those individuals whose passwords won't be expiring include new accounts that were created, as well as anyone who changed or had their password reset, all within the last six months.

Going forward, your password will expire six months from the date when you last changed it. You will always get notified two weeks prior to each expiration date.


