CCM AND RUTGERS EXPAND PARTNERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES FOR BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION STUDENTS

The partnership between County College of Morris (CCM) and Rutgers University continues to strengthen after a signing ceremony, on the CCM Randolph Campus, expanded the opportunity for CCM students to earn a bachelor's degree from Rutgers.

The agreement, effective September 2018, allows students who obtain an A.A. in Business Administration at CCM to remain on the Randolph campus and complete a B.S. in Marketing or a B.S. in Leadership and Management from Rutgers, or they may take courses at other Rutgers University locations. Onsite academic advising at CCM is offered by Rutgers' staff.

WI-FI UPGRADES PLANNED

Information Systems and Institutional Effectiveness (ISIE) is working on expanding coverage, improving connectivity and increasing the bandwidth of CCM's wireless network in 2018. In addition to already tripling our bandwidth, we are increasing the number of access points and the wireless security across the campus. This will be a staged deployment.

Beginning in the Academic Complex, in February, the first phase adds 101 new access points in these buildings to greatly improve Wi-Fi coverage in our primary learning areas. The second stage, beginning in May, includes Henderson Hall, Music Technology, the Learning Resource Center, Landscaping and Horticultural Technology, and Plant and Maintenance buildings. In those buildings, 41 new access points will be added. The third stage will begin in August and includes the Student Community Center and Health and Physical Education Buildings, adding 24 more access points.

ISIE also is going to analyze wireless connectivity in the auditorium and gymnasium as part of the third stage. The deployment includes integrating a more secure wireless network using a single (one-time) sign-on for each semester.

U.S. DEPARTMENT OF STATE IMPROVES SAFETY AND SECURITY MESSAGING FOR U.S. CITIZENS

The Bureau of Consular Affairs (CA) serves as the public face of the Department of State (DOS) and is responsible for the welfare and protection of U.S. citizens abroad, the issuance of passports and other documentation to citizens and nationals, and the protection of U.S. border security and the facilitation of legitimate travel to the U.S. The CA issues travel information in the form of safety and security messaging on its website, travel.state.gov, for U.S. citizens traveling internationally.

In December 2017, the CA redesigned this website, making it more mobile-friendly and easier to navigate, and made other product improvements as well. Travel administrators, risk professionals, individual travelers and others may benefit from familiarizing themselves with this new information to help inform their travel planning and decisions.

New IRS Withholding Tables

The new tax withholding tables were released by the IRS as part of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act. These new rates will be reflected in the first payroll of February. These are not retroactive for the month of January.

Tax Year 2017 W-2s

CCM employees can access their 2017 W-2s via CCM WebAdvisor. Online W-2s are required by law for county employees. The Payroll department will not be printing and mailing any W-2s. If you have any problems printing your W-2, please do not hesitate to contact the Payroll department.


