## CCM OFFERS FREE SUMMER CYBER SECURITY CAMP FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

With \$59,800 in funding from the National Security Agency and National Science Foundation, CCM will be offering two one-week identical GenCyber summer camps in August through its Center for Cyber Security in the Department of Information Technologies. The camps, introducing high school students to the field of cyber security and possible career opportunities, will provide an interactive, immersive experience that is both fun and educational.

Through the GenCyber program, camp participants at CCM will learn sound cyber security principles, garner an increased awareness and interest in cyber security careers, and gain an understanding of correct and safe online behavior. GenCyber is a national program to increase interest in cyber security careers and diversity in the workforce.

Purchasing needs to determine, if in the aggregate, we have exceeded any legal thresholds that would require public advertisement. Capital Items that are available under a state contract or a consortium, eliminate the need for public advertisement; therefore, a June 30 delivery may still be achievable.
