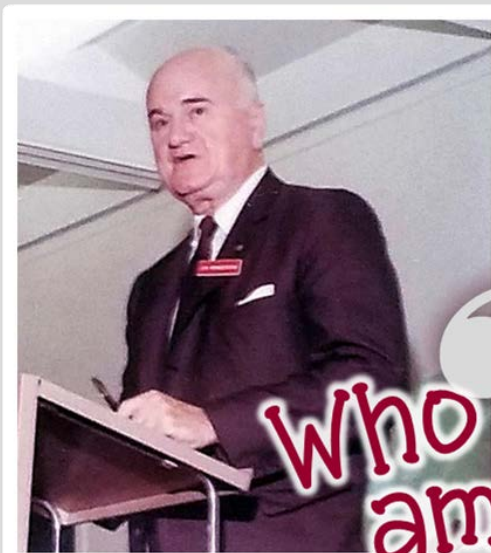

NEW STUDENT ID CODE

A student ID with the code NEW where the validation sticker normally appears indicates that the student has registered for classes and still needs to pay their bill. This change will allow new students to have a CCM ID when conducting business on campus, receive their parking permit and Library bar code over the summer when there are less students on campus. Once a student pays their bill, they should come to the Campus Life Information Window to receive a validation sticker.



PERS CONTRIBUTION RATE INCREASE

Pursuant to P.L 2011, c. 78 (Chapter 78), the Pension and Health Benefit Reform, Public Employees Retirement System (PERS) employee pension contribution rates will increase from 7.34 percent to 7.5 percent of base salary with the first paycheck issued after July 1, 2018.
