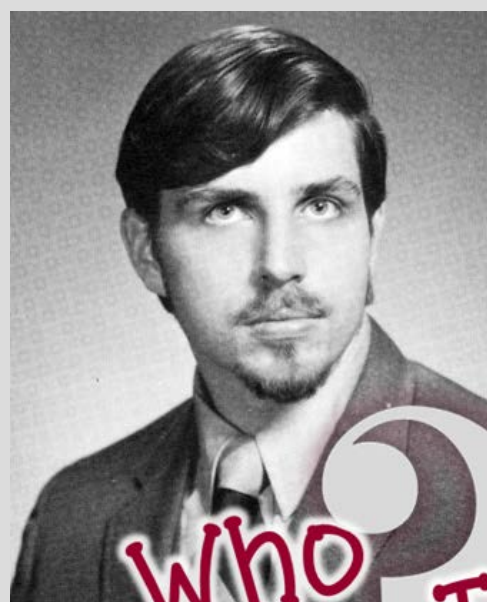

CCM WIRELESS EXPANSION PHASE 2 UPDATE

The Information Systems-Institutional Effectiveness (IS-IE) division has started integrating the latest security standards into CCM's wireless network. IS-IE is adding single sign on to the wireless network which means you'll sign on once every semester instead of every day. This security and login improvement will include the guest network. The division is in the initial steps of implementation, but is moving quickly towards the testing phase. Plant and Maintenance has begun running lines for the new 43 additional Wi-Fi access points that are being installed in Henderson Hall, Music Technology Center, Learning Resource Center, Landscaping and Horticultural Technology and the Plant and Maintenance building. Phase 2 of the Wi-Fi expansion is on target for completion by the end of August.
