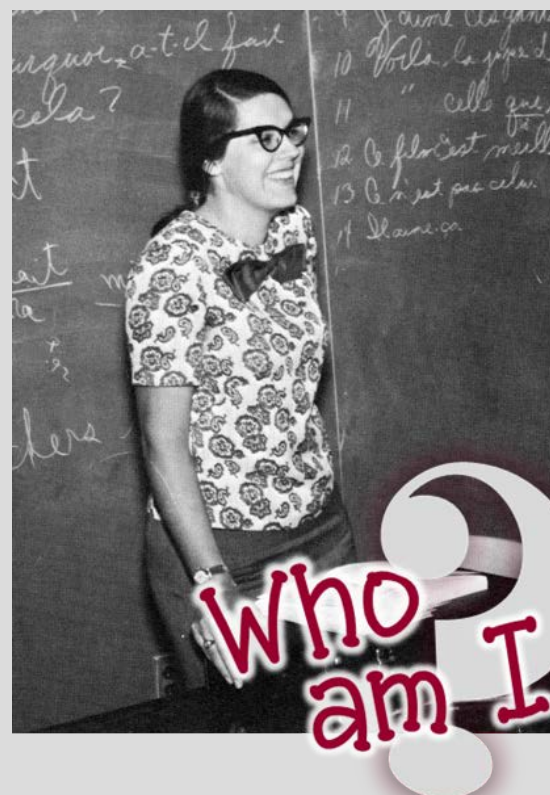
## WHAT IS YOUR DEPARTMENT PLANNING?

In preparation for this event, please begin familiarizing yourselves with the newest version (UI 5.6) which is currently installed on your desktop.

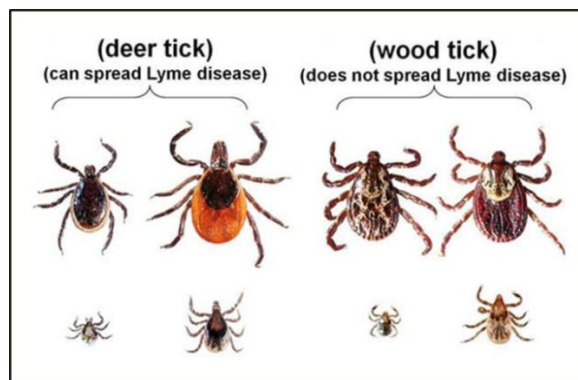

## TICK ALERT FROM HEALTH SERVICES

According to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, this summer has yielded more tick-borne illnesses than ever before in New Jersey. With several new bacterial strains related to a variety of ticks, just getting a Lyme titer done is not always enough. If you experience flu-like symptoms during the summer (fever, eye pain, headache, chills, muscle stiffness) and/or have a rash similar looking to bullseye, see your doctor immediately and request all available blood tests for the tick strains and ask if starting the antibiotic (Doxycycline) is prudent. It is important to keep in mind, if you have flu-like symptoms and they are from a tick bite, those symptoms will go away after about 10 days; then in about a month you will develop orthopedic-type pain and stiffness. That, as well, will dissipate and then within another month the bacterial infection will begin to spread to organs and that is why we read about folks being laid up for years with tick-borne illness; it is because they ignored the flu-like symptoms at the onset. 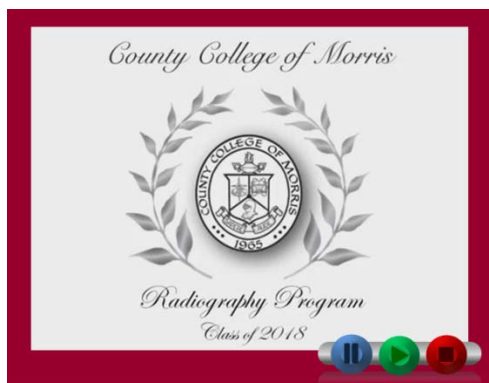
