GET EMERGENCY ALERTS WITH ALERTMORRIS

AlertMorris, which replaces Morris County’s McUrgent and Everbridge systems, is now available to residents, businesses and those who do business or travel through Morris County.

Signing up is simple:

Create your profile by visiting the Morris County website: <https://morriscountynj.gov/about/municipalities/>. Click on the green “Emergency Alert” icon for your town to register through your municipal notification system. Users have the ability to enter multiple addresses located in multiple jurisdictions within a single profile. If you care for a loved one who lives in another Morris County town and want to be notified of issues affecting that person’s municipality, your one registration process will satisfy that need. Although all data from the county’s previous notification system have been exported to AlertMorris, which should provide for a seamless transfer process, previous users still are encouraged to re-register to ensure the new system has all of your pertinent information.

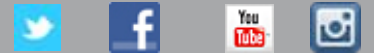
