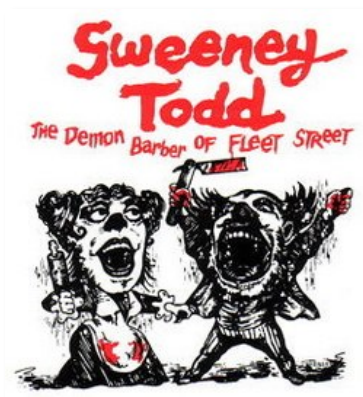
The Department of Public Safety will respond to the incident site and determine the appropriate course of action to be taken.
