WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT WEEKLY ENROLLMENT REPORT

As CCM continues building its culture of evidence steeped in the use of data for decision making and expands its Workforce Development (WFD) and Continuing Education enrollment opportunities, it is important to routinely look at enrollment in that area, similar to the daily credit enrollment report. Institutional Research (IR) has worked with Associate Vice President Patrick Enright to develop an enrollment report highlighting registrations and headcounts trends. This report compliments the credit enrollment report and together they provide more complete enrollment data for the college. This new WFD report will be distributed every Friday to Administrative Council members, as well as department chairs. SELF-SERVICE PORTAL FUNCTIONING WELL

During the Spring Semester, CCM moved from a dependency-based Technology Help Desk model to a self-serve-based model by launching the CCM Self-Service Portal. The intent was to provide a single online location offering easy and quick access to the solutions for the majority of questions received from students, faculty and staff. Information Systems-Institutional Effectiveness is pleased to report that the portal is functioning exactly as planned. During the first week of the Fall Semester, August 31 to September 9, there were 435 views of the main portal page and people averaged 14 seconds on that page. This implies the landing page functions as intended by quickly allowing individuals to determine the next step to finding the information they are seeking. The student page had 998 views with an average of 34 seconds on that page. Students were locating the information they needed and spending time learning how to complete the action they were looking up online. The faculty/staff page had 302 views with an average 43 seconds on the page. Based on that data, among others, it, too, is serving its purpose well. The Solution Center and computer solution specialists still field and respond to inquiries not provided on the portal, but we are pleased by the use of the self-serve portal for routine technology questions.
