## PURCHASING REQUISITION TRAINING

There are many facets involved in creating a purchase requisition (PR). Learn how to access and utilize Web Req to create purchase requisitions quickly. This training will touch upon how to create a PR in Web Req and REQM, how to modify your PR, how to use split accounting on PRs, check the status of your PR and more. In addition Purchasing will touch upon some basic PR information to help reduce the number of questions and oversights when creating a PR. If you have a requisition that needs to be created be sure to bring that information with you so you can create your requisition in class.

## NEW JERSEY NATURAL GAS PRESENTS GIFT TO CCM

## CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTION PROJECT

In October, CCM's Plant & Maintenance Department will begin a 6-month project to install carbon monoxide detectors in all CCM buildings with fuel-burning appliances/equipment. The project was initiated in response to modifications to the New Jersey Uniform Fire Code requiring installation of detectors in the immediate vicinity and adjacent spaces of all potential sources of carbon monoxide. Potential sources at CCM include some heating systems, hot water heaters and emergency generators.

The battery-operated, standalone systems will sound an audible alarm in the immediate area if carbon monoxide levels exceed the set point. Students, faculty, staff and employees are to leave the area upon hearing a carbon monoxide alarm, and contact Public Safety at extension 5550 from a campus phone or 973-328-5550 from a cell phone.

The Randolph Township Fire Official has approved our implementation plan and will confirm compliance after the detectors are installed. The project includes new mounted in devices in required locations, procedure updates, handheld detectors, and a timeline for inspections and replacement.

CCM will hold an Open House on Saturday, October 13, for students and their parents, and others interested in advancing their education.

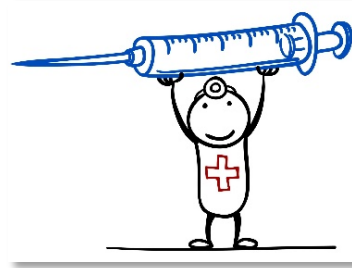
