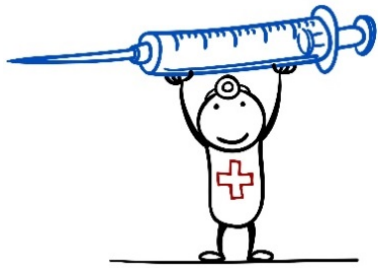

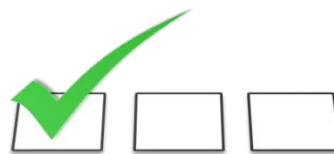
CCM ADMINISTRATORS RECEIVE TECHNOLOGY LEADERSHIP AWARDS

During this first of six meetings during the academic year, several topics will be covered, including, but not limited to, the kinds of articles you should write (and how), how to connect those articles with the appropriate markets, how to contact magazine and book publishers, and what compensation you should expect. Also to be discussed is how to improve your writing by looking at the beginnings of famous works of fiction and non-fiction.

Dr. Kenneth Shouler, philosophy professor, will lead the discussion. Shouler has published books in philosophy, politics, business, sports and religion, and has authored hundreds of articles for mass-market and academic publications.
