

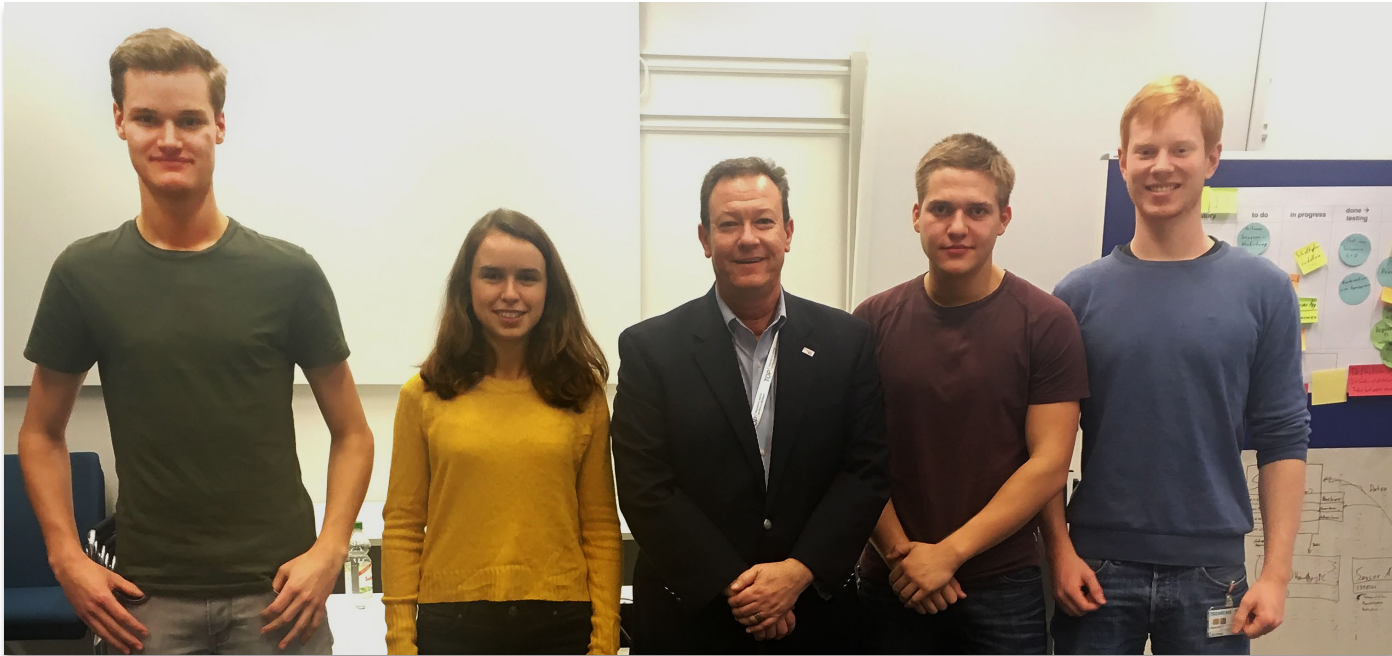

DR IACONO PARTICIPATES IN APPRENTICESHIP INFORMATION TOUR IN GERMANY

Dr. Anthony J. Iacono, along with 11 other education and workforce officials from across the country, recently completed a tour of Germany to examine that country’s apprenticeship programs and vocational education system.

The trip was arranged and fully funded through the Transatlantic Outreach Program (TOP), an initiative of the Goethe Institut. TOP’s mission is to bring North Americans and Germans together to enhance the global competencies of students, bridge the skills gap between education and workforce development, and strengthen the grassroots bonds of transatlantic partnership.

The tour consisted of visiting vocational schools and employers with expansive apprenticeship programs, such as Deutsche Bank, Robert Bosch, Siemens and John Deere Deutschland. The goal of the trip, which took place October 21 – 27, was to learn how the United States might be able to expand experiential learning opportunities for students with the support of industry.

DISTANCE EDUCATION COURSE DESIGNATION DEFINITIONS

The Virtual Campus Office would like to share the following new course designation definitions that will be used starting in the Spring 2019 semester.

Hybrid (HYBD):

Courses that require students to meet approximately 25% to 75% face-to-face are considered hybrid distance learning courses. Face-to-face meetings may include but are not limited to lectures, active learning sessions, learner-centered discussions, group-work projects, presentations, posters, demonstrations, performance art, movies, laboratory experiences, and assessments.

Online (ONL):

Courses that are designed and developed with all instruction is delivered via the web and mediated by technology. Some online courses may require face-to-face proctored testing whether at CCM or other approved institutions. On-campus proctored testing is provided at the CCM Testing Center for our hosted online courses. Off-campus proctored testing can be provided by any Testing Center certified by the National College Testing Association (NCTA). Contact the Testing Center at 973-328-6166 or testingcenter@ccm.edu for information regarding off-campus or out-of-state proctored testing services.

Virtual Campus (VIR):

Fully online courses, certificates, or programs designed to provide students quality distance education consistent with the Virtual Campus' mission. There is no on-campus requirement.
