The first class participating in CCM's Culinary Opportunity Program (COP) for Adults with Developmental Disabilities received their certificate of completion this week. The students even received a certificate from Congresswoman Miki Sherrill to celebrate their accomplishments.

Paul Licitra, chair of the CCM Board of Trustees, CCM President Anthony J Iacono, parents and other invited guests were treated to a luncheon prepared by the students. The four students who received their certificates met with representatives from restaurants and grocery stores that also were in attendance.

The Department of Hospitality Management and Culinary Arts developed the COP program in response to a growing need to provide adults with developmental disabilities with greater opportunities. Each COP session is limited to eight students. Registration is now taking place for the second program.

DATA WAREHOUSE UPDATE

The Information Systems – Institutional Effectiveness division is migrating CCM's data warehouse for business intelligence from an on-premise solution to a cloud-based solution. CCM PROFESSOR TAKES PART IN GERMAN APPRENTICESHIP TOUR

CCM Professor Ian Colquhoun, Engineering Technologies/ Engineering Science, recently traveled to Germany as a guest of the German Foreign Ministry with the Goethe-Institut Transatlantic Outreach Program as part of a small group of career and technical professionals in the areas of vocational training and workforce development.

The team spent two intensive weeks immersing themselves in the German apprenticeship program and how it sets up individuals and businesses for maximum success. The group had the pleasure of visiting over a dozen schools from 1st to 12th grade, as well as the four types of colleges that comprise the German secondary school system. Here students and administrators, faculty and staff were interviewed on a range of topics.

Colquhoun also visited with about a dozen offices of employment, the education ministry, and state and federal education specialists, as well as many businesses from small and medium sized enterprise to larger companies.

The culture and society of Germany and its people were studied and compared with that in the U.S. In addition, the team of career and technical professionals met with state and federal officials to learn of the funding sources and financial structure of education and business in the country.

In 2018, President Anthony J. Iacono traveled to Germany as part of a Transatlantic Outreach Program team to examine the country's apprenticeship and vocational education programs.
