

CCM EMAIL SYSTEM MIGRATING TO CLOUD PLATFORM

The Information Systems department is starting the process of moving CCM's Faculty/Staff email system to the Microsoft Office365 cloud. Most of this process will be transparent to you, the end user. The main benefits of doing this are improved spam and phishing filtering, increased system reliability and an improved Outlook Web Access interface for off-campus access.


The first step is to phase out the current spam filter. All external email will start going to the cloud email server, which will then forward the filtered mail down to an on-premise server where all CCM accounts currently reside. Once the switch has been made, you will no longer see the spam filter message that currently accompanies all messages coming from outside CCM.

Once the first step is completed, further testing of the cloud system will commence with IS staff email accounts. When satisfied with the process, migration of accounts to the cloud server will begin. Employees will be notified prior to their account being migrated. The plan is to schedule the migrations overnight to minimize disruption. Project completion is expected in 2020.


GET YOUR FLU SHOT





RETIREMENT PLANNING SEMINARS

The New Jersey Division of Pensions & Benefits (NJDPB) has scheduled in-person Retirement Planning Seminars for members of the Public Employees' Retirement System (PERS), Teachers' Pension and Annuity Fund (TPAF), and Police and Firemen's Retirement System (PFRS) through the remainder of 2019.

Retirement Planning Seminars take a step-by-step approach to the retirement process and explain what happens after submitting an application. Sessions are approximately three hours in duration and include a Q&A period. All attendees must register online to assure adequate seating. If you wish to bring a guest, they must also register. Enter the same employer information as the member but use your guest's name and four-digit Social Security number.
