## REGISTRATION OPEN FOR WINTERIM AND SPRING 2020

Applications for both the Winterim and Spring 2020 semesters are now being accepted at CCM. By registering early, students are presented with the best opportunity to enroll in classes that take place on the days and times that best fit their schedules. Enrolling in Winterim classes also is a good way to stay on track to graduate.

Two Winterim sessions are offered, a four-week session that begins on December 19, and a two-week session that begins on January 6. Offered in a condensed format and online, Winterim classes make it easy to earn more college credits.

The Spring 2020 Semester begins on January 22. Several mini-term sessions are also offered during that semester.

## CAMPUS SAFETY AWARENESS WORKSHOPS

The Department of Public Safety will be providing a Campus Safety Awareness Program for faculty, adjunct faculty and staff. The sessions will provide information on how to prepare for, prevent and respond to situations on campus that could affect your safety and well-being. Topics include preparedness, prevention, survival mindset, reactionary time, situational awareness, emergency notifications, cover versus concealment, lock-down techniques and evacuation plans.

The sessions are an hour and 15 minutes in length and will be offered on the following dates:

## VIRTUAL CAMPUS INTRODUCES A NEW ONLINE PROCTORING SERVICE

The Virtual Campus is introducing ProctorU, an online proctoring service, which will be available to faculty members and students beginning this Winterim session. ProctorU provides several different options to observe student behavior during an exam to preserve academic integrity. Faculty members are not required to give proctored exams and are not required to use ProctorU. However, faculty members requiring proctored exams may choose to administer their exams using an on-campus Testing Center or ProctorU. Accreditation and transfer requirements mandate that if proctored exams are part of an online course, faculty members must choose one of the options. ProctorU will alleviate the need for a student to make alternate arrangement to sit for his or her exams at another approved Testing Center, usually at a significant cost to the students, if the CCM Testing Center is closed or if the student is unable to come to campus.

The Center for Teaching and Learning will be offering training sessions in November and December.


