

CCM Launching a New COVID-19 Health Monitoring App and Titan Alert System



- Daily health checks

CCM for the Fall Semester initiated a temperature screening program at building entrances. When launched, we knew temperature screening in the winter months would be challenging due to colder temperatures. Being exposed to cold air typically results in inaccurate temperature readings. As we move into January 2021, CCM will switch pading and using the app. our college

To help ensure the safety and wellbeing of the campus community,

from temperature screening to the use of the Rave Guardian App. By downloading and using the app, our college community can report any COVID symptoms and then receive a "cleared" or "do not report to campus" message. Monitors will be present at campus entrances to ensure that those entering our buildings are able to display the "cleared" screen on their phone. We will have contingencies for those who do not have a smartphone or who experience technical difficulty. The app will be available for download starting on Monday, December 28, and will be tested by essential personnel who work through the holiday break. Rave Guardian offers many other important safety features, which will be phased in as we approach the start of the 2021 Spring Semester.

The software behind our Titan Alert system is also changing. Rave Alert is being phased in over the next few weeks as our new Titan Alert service. Be on the lookout for a welcome email from Rave. It is very important that you log in and update your profile in this new system, using your CCM email address as your username.

Both Rave Alert and Rave Guardian are complimentary systems which allow us to build a more robust campus messaging platform. Rave is being integrated with Alertus, an additional system which will direct emergency notifications to "popup" on campus computer desktop screens. More information will be provided on Alertus after the Winter Break.

Here is step-by-step guide of what you will need to do:

- 1. Receive welcome email from Rave
- 2. Log in
- 3. Update your profile use CCM email as username
- 4. Download the app beginning December 28
- 5. Use the app and be "cleared" when coming to campus

COVID-19 Testing Center Opens on Campus

As a reminder, a COVID-19 testing center opened on campus this week. The college has partnered with the Morris County Office of Emergency Management to provide this important service to help protect the health of Morris County residents. This is the second time CCM has been the site for COVID-19 testing. This time, however, the testing is being conducted as a walk-in, rather than a drive-through, center. The testing is restricted to the Davidson Rooms, the nearby restrooms and Parking Lot 6. A temporary plastic wall has been installed to isolate the area from the rest of the SCC. Individuals being tested also have been provided with a private entrance to maintain their distance from the college community. Testing is taking place on Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and is by appointment only, which limits the number of individuals coming to campus at one time. The testing center on campus is part of a broader county-wide plan that incorporates multiple testing locations, along with visit at-home testing.
