Vietnam Veterans Memorial “The Moving Wall” Coming to CCM VFW Post 7333 of Randolph Brings Traveling Tribute to the Area

Residents from Morris County and beyond will have a special opportunity to experience the power and poignancy of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial when The Moving Wall, a half-size replica, comes to CCM in July at the initiative of VFW Post 7333 of Randolph.

The Moving Wall will be at the college from July 7 – July 10. Several special events will be held during that time, including the laying of wreaths at the site and recognizing Vietnam Gold Star Families, who lost a loved one during the war, along with rifle salutes and the playing of Taps. Visitors, who lost someone in the Vietnam War, will be able to make a rubbing of their loved one’s name from the wall.

“This will be an opportunity for people to experience the Vietnam wall, honor our fallen service members and veterans, and a time to help bring healing to veterans, families and friends who suffered through this divisive conflict,” said Bill Menzel from VFW Post 7333, the project coordinator. “The Moving Wall additionally is intended to educate youth about the Vietnam War and its impact on the nation and veterans.”

“We are honored to have been asked to host The Moving Wall at CCM, to recognize the men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice during the Vietnam War, and to teach the next generation about the impact and lessons learned as a result of this time in our nation’s history,” said Dr. Anthony J. Iacono, president of CCM.

Supporting the efforts to bring the wall to the college are the Morris County Board of County Commissioners.

VFW Post 7333 is looking for volunteers to assist while the wall is at the campus. The cost to bring the wall to Morris County is estimated at \$30,000 and donations are being sought to help to defray that cost. To volunteer or to make a donation, go to www.vfwpost7333.org/the-moving-wall/.

What to Do if You, a Fellow Employee or Student Tests Positive

If you receive a positive PCR test, have an exposure to someone with a positive diagnosis or experience any COVID-19 symptoms at any point in time, it is imperative you report your symptoms to the college:

EMPLOYEES must notify Human Resources via email at HRCOVID@ccm.edu and their supervisor immediately, whether working on-campus or remotely. If employees are uncertain about any protocols or COVID-19 exposures or symptoms, contact HRCOVID@ccm.edu.

STUDENTS must always notify their professor and the Office of Student Development & Enrollment Management at dsd@ccm.edu any time they experience symptoms, whether learning on-campus or online. The Office of Student Development & Enrollment Management is responsible for communicating with the student – and any other students – about next steps and updates.

NOTICE is hereby given that at the regular public meeting of the Board of Trustees of County College of Morris to be held on **Tuesday, January 25, 2022, at 6:45 p.m.**, in the Learning Resource Center, Room 121, on the campus of the County College of Morris, 214 Center Grove Road, Randolph, NJ, the Board of Trustees will consider approval of the college budget for fiscal year 2022-2023 and submission of the budget to the Board of School Estimate pursuant to NJSA 18A:64A-17; and the Board of Trustees will consider the tuition rates and college fee, and revisions to the Schedule of Fees.

At the regular public meeting on January 25, 2022, and prior to the Board's consideration and action upon the college budget, establishment of the tuition rates and college fee, and revisions to the Schedule of Fees, the Board of Trustees shall conduct public hearings to afford an opportunity for members of the college community to address the proposed budget, tuition rates and fees. An itemized statement of the college budget, together with comparative data for the prior year, is now on file and open to examination by the public at the offices of the Division of Business and Finance, County College of Morris, 214 Center Grove Road, Randolph Township, New Jersey, 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, until said date of the public hearings.
