



WHAT YOU WILL LEARN

The mission of the English as a Second Language (ESL) program is to give students the academic English skills and cultural knowledge they need to complete a degree at a U.S. college where English is the principal language.

The ESL program at County College of Morris (CCM) consists of Reading, Writing and Conversation courses organized into three levels. Students are placed into the appropriate level according to a placement test. The ESL program is not for beginners. Students must have a basic understanding of English grammar and vocabulary. The ESL program is currently not a certificate or degree program.

WHY STUDY ESL AT CCM?

With only three levels, the ESL Program at CCM is an intensive and accelerated curriculum. A full-time student who begins at Level I can start taking major courses during the summer of their first year; students who place in Level III can begin their major within the first semester. The majority of classes in the ESL Program are taught by full-time faculty who hold at least a master's degree in ESL, TESOL, or Applied Linguistics.
