Public health promotes and protects the health of people and the communities where they live, learn, work and play. The health of the community involves populations at risk, education and prevention programs, methods of assuring access to appropriate and cost-effective care, and the formation of sound public policies. Public health professionals play a vital role in improving community health issues such as the quality of life for the elderly, nutrition, food safety, water quality, vaccination programs, bio-terrorism, natural disasters, infectious diseases, as well as drug, alcohol, and tobacco abuse.

The Associate of Science in Public Health at County College of Morris (CCM) provides the introductory coursework and foundations for a future career in public health. The program is designed for transfer to four-year institution to earn a baccalaureate degree or higher in Public Health.

CAREERS

There are a wide variety of careers in Public Health, some requiring a master's degree. Examples include:

- Social and Community Service Managers
- Health Educators
- Public Health Administrators

Public health and related careers have average salaries between \$41,000 and \$77,000.

Employment of healthcare occupations is projected to grow 14 percent from 2018 to 2028, much faster than the average for all occupations, adding about 1.9 million new jobs. Healthcare occupations are projected to add more jobs than any of the other occupational groups. This projected growth is mainly due to an aging population, leading to greater demand for healthcare services.
