

You are encouraged to submit an admissions application and all supporting documents during your senior year in high school (if you are currently a high school student) or several months before the start of a semester. Completing the application process early will help you be able to register for the courses you want.

County College of Morris (CCM) welcomes applications from freshman, transfer, and international students and completed applications are reviewed on a rolling basis.

If you wish to take a course at CCM while you are enrolled in high school, please refer to the Challenger Program brochure, available through the Admissions Office, your Guidance Office, or online at www.ccm.edu.

• APPLICATION CHECKLIST

Please submit all of the appropriate materials to the Admissions Office.

- Admissions application and \$30 non-refundable application fee (you may also submit an admissions application on-line at www.ccm.edu.) Applications will be processed upon receipt of application fee;
- Official high school transcript in a sealed envelope or a copy of your General Equivalency Diploma (GED);
- Official college transcripts in sealed envelopes from all colleges attended (if you are pursuing a CCM degree); and
- Bring your original, valid (not expired) permanent residency card ("green card" or passport/I-551 or employment authorization with valid extension date) to the Admissions Office so we can make a copy of your original document(s).

In addition, please refer to the Placement Testing Information section to find out if you will need to take any placement tests. Your acceptance letter will indicate which tests (if any) you must take.

• PROCEDURES FOR STUDENTS RETURNING TO CCM

- If you previously attended CCM as a matriculated (pursuing an associate's degree) student, you do not have to submit a new admissions application or fee; you may proceed to register for courses (if you attended another college and would like credits transferred to CCM, please submit official transcripts to the CCM Admissions Office);
- If you previously attended CCM as a non-matriculated (not pursuing an associate's degree) student but now wish to pursue a degree, you must go to the office of Records and Registration to matriculate.

• PLACEMENT TESTING INFORMATION

To assist a faculty advisor with your course placement, all students (except those exempt as described below) pursuing an associate's degree or academic program certificate must take the Accuplacer basic skills placement test in the areas of writing, computation, elementary algebra and computer literacy.

If you are not pursuing a CCM degree (non-matriculating), you must provide documentation at the time of registration that you have satisfied course prerequisites (i.e., placement testing, ACT/SAT scores, unofficial college transcript).

Please note that you must submit an admissions application before taking the Accuplacer Test.

- If you are pursuing a major that requires a higher level of mathematics competency (Engineering Science, Biology Specialization, Chemistry, Mathematics, Biotechnology, Chemical Technology, Chemical Technology- Environmental Science Option, Computer Info Systems- Computer Science Option, Computer Info Systems- Game Development Option), you must take the College Level Math (CLM) test.
- If English is not your native language, you must take the Levels of English Proficiency (LOEP) test.
- To schedule your placement tests, please call the Testing Center at 973-328-5166.

Your admissions acceptance letter will give you official notification of any placement tests you must take, but please note that you are exempt from placement testing if you:

- **SAT's taken before March 2016:** Earned a score of 540 or higher on the Critical Reading and 530 or higher on the Math section of the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT). SAT scores older than 7 years will not qualify for Accuplacer testing exemption;
- **SAT's taken after March 2016:** Earned a score of 590 or higher on the Evidenced-based Reading & Writing (ERW) and 560 or higher on the Math section of the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT);
- Earned a score of 23 or higher in ACT English and a 23 or higher in ACT Mathematics. ACT scores older than 7 years will not qualify for Accuplacer testing exemption;
- Earned credit for college-level English Composition and Mathematics courses or have completed developmental courses at another college less than 7 years ago;
- Have taken Accuplacer placement tests at another college (please submit copies of your test results and appropriate course placements to the Testing Center).

• INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Applicants who wish to attend CCM on a visa should call the Admissions Office at 973-328-5100 and request an International Student Application Packet or request the packet on-line at www.ccm.edu.
